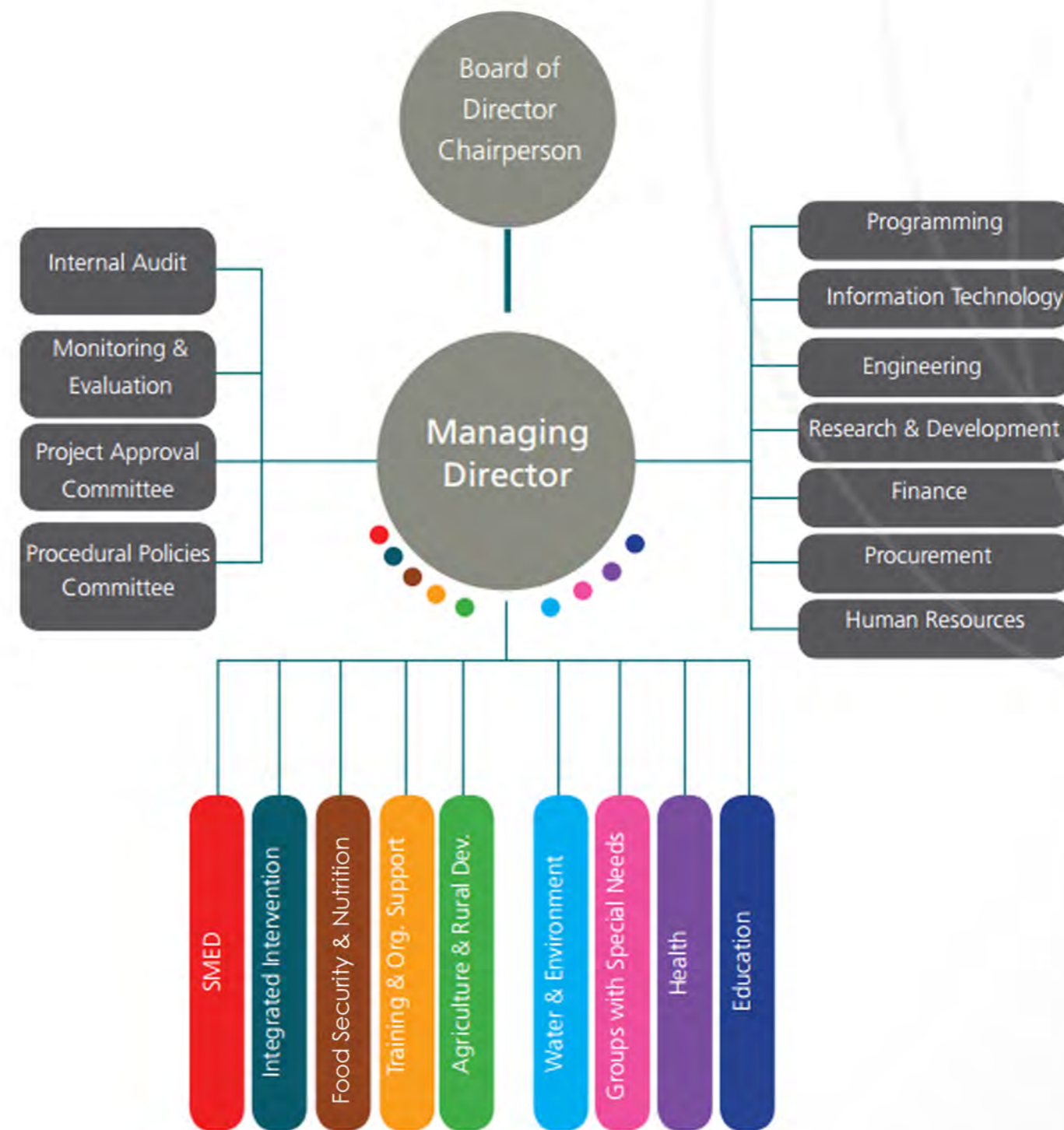
## Who we are

Subject: **Micro Assessment Results**

Greetings, I hope this message finds you well.

I am pleased to inform you that the Micro Assessment exercise for **Building Foundation for Development** has been completed. This exercise, in line with the Harmonized Approach to Cash Transfers (HACT), calls for an upfront micro-assessment of the financial management capacity of partners. HACT is the sole framework applied by the adopting United Nations (UN) agencies when transferring cash to implementing partners.

Micro-assessments have several benefits. Firstly, they support the establishment of appropriate cash transfer modalities, procedures and assurance activities. Second, they serve as a resource to identify areas for capacity development and support to partners. Furthermore, monitoring plans are developed in collaboration with the partners to support capacity development and financial system strengthening.

The micro-assessment revealed that the overall risk rating for **Building Foundation for Development** is **Low**. As a follow up, we suggest a meeting to discuss the findings and the suggested areas for improvement. Kindly let us know a time that would be convenient. We also request that you submit a quarterly update on the status of implementation of each of the recommendations, which we can discuss during the meeting.

Attached please find the report that provides further details on each of the fundamental areas that was assessed.

I would like to thank you for your cooperation during the process and look forward to continued collaborations with **Building Foundation for Development**.

## Health Sector



BFD is implementing health projects within the emergency program funded by various donors like OCHA, UNICEF, and UNFPA, the health projects aim to provide integrated health services including primary health care and RH through supporting existing health facilities and mobile teams.

The main objectives of the health sector are in the provision of integrated life saving health services for the affected people and contributing in the sustainability of project delivery after completion by strengthening the capacity of health care workers and rebuilding trust between health service providers and beneficiaries in addition to :

- Rehabilitation and furnishing health facilities
- Training health workers
- Distribution of health kits
- Establishing DTCS and ORCs
- Provision of medical supplies and equipment
- Capacity building

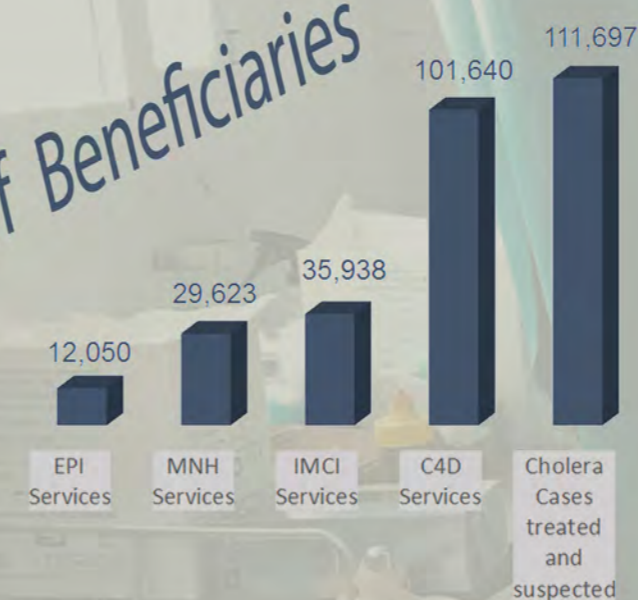

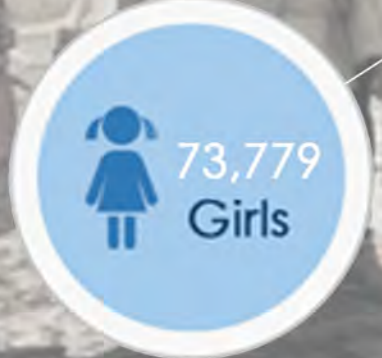
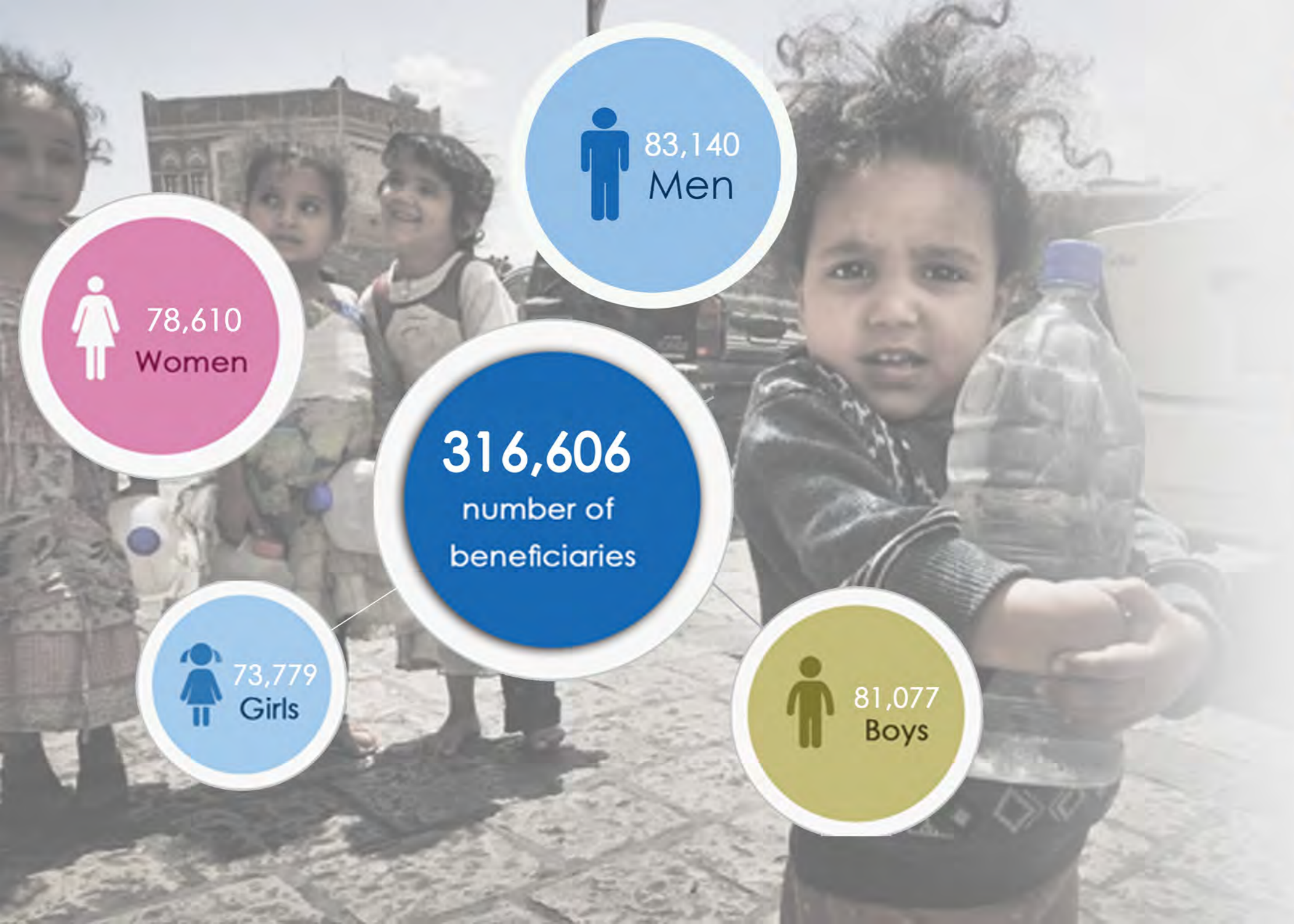
